The ongoing Covid pandemic has also reiterated the need for strong mental health provision within learning organisations as the changes to social relationships and continued lockdown has led to increased mental health concerns and issues amongst learners.

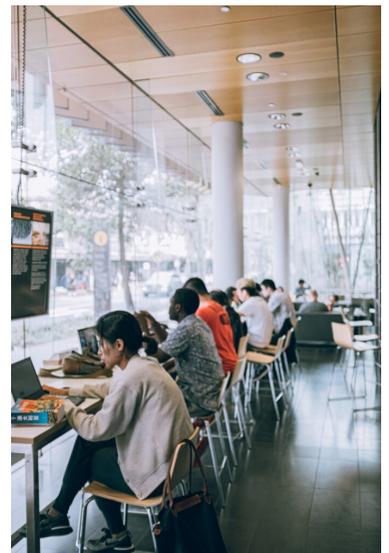
We are now close to the end of the project which has been extended into March 2022, and the final Intellectual Outputs and deliverables will be available for widespread use very shortly.

IO2: Learning Materials

One of the key outputs for the project is the development of learning materials to help support learners throughout their learning journey. Each partner in the project, identified what their specific organisational needs were in this area, before developing materials to assist and/or support the specific needs – therefore, the OSCAR project has developed multiple learning materials based on identified need, which can be utilised by any other organisations as they see fit.

Each package of materials is being piloted and we are currently implementing any feedback and/or changes that may have come out of the piloting that has taken place.
